Since Gonzales wasn't able to teach for a whole year, he dedicated his time to exercise and video games. When asked what he did as recovery from his heart transplant he said, "My recovery was a lot of different stages. First, I moved in with my parents for six months so they could help me around. Starting at three months, I went to cardiac rehab. After I graduated from the class, I started exercising three to five times a week, walking and also balancing the workouts with a healthy diet."

Gonzales also found himself with some free time. "I also played a lot of video games. I played Pokemon Moon and a lot of Call of Duty. I also had board game nights with the family."

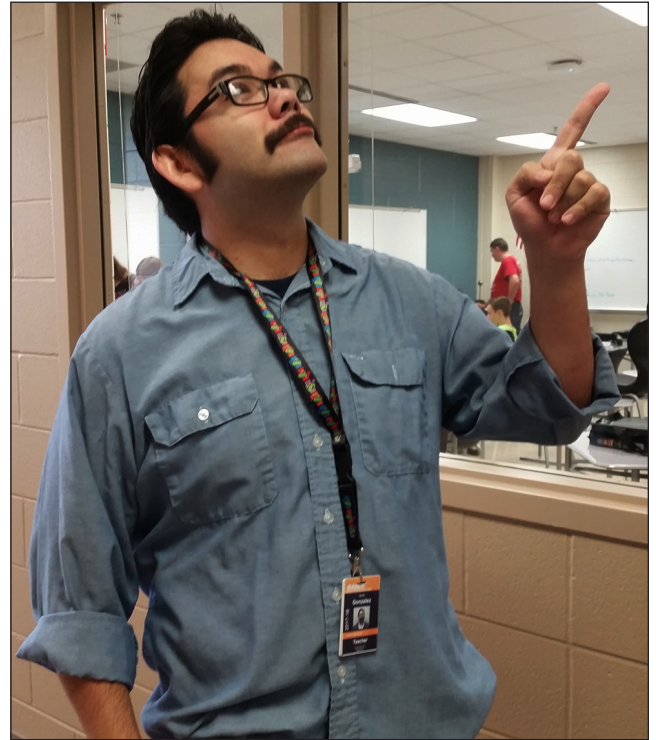
Since Mr. G missed a whole school year, he is happy to be back in school. Mr. G explained that he was most excited about being around people.

"When I was in recovery, it was hard because I'm really social and now that I'm back with the people I talk to I feel great."

One of Mr. G's best friends is Math teacher Mr. Severino. When asked how they became really good friends, Severino answered, "Video games. He was the one who got me into video games. We hang out a lot and play Destiny 2."

For those who are unaware, Gonzales and Severino are good friends. They can be seen joking around and talking with each other between passing periods.

Severino said that he and Gonzales stayed in touch throughout the whole process. Severino said, "I would talk to him three to four times a week just to see what was going on. I also went to the
